The abilities and limits of the equipment are included, along with basic operating procedures, pre-operation checks and methods of warning other employees that a forklift is in the work area.

Lessons consist of the placement of the chock blocks and trailer tires, the arrangement of pallets to distribute the load properly, and checks required prior to driving into a trailer at a dock location. Courses also include Material Safety Data Sheet (or MSDS) training. Even though not related directly to the use of a lift truck, MSDS training is important if an operator notices a leaking container or damages a container containing toxic materials. MSDS sheets list the products, their effects on people and correct ways of handling spills.
